

Haris Hajrulahovic (Bosnia and Herzegovina) was appointed as Head of WHO Country Office and WHO Representative to the Republic of Moldova in November 2015. As Head of WHO Country Office and WHO Representative, Haris Hajrulahovic is responsible for management of WHO core functions, implementation of technical cooperation with the Republic of Moldova, implementation of Biennial Collaborative Agreement activities at country level, including three major projects, and leadership in key functional areas.

Prior to this appointment, Haris was Head of WHO Country Office in Bosnia and Herzegovina (2003-2015), where, in addition to his generic responsibilities, he was responsible for the implementation of three major projects on health system strengthening and integrated care delivery.

Before joining WHO, Haris started his medical career at the Clinical Centre of the University of Sarajevo.

Besides undergraduate education at the University of Sarajevo, Haris holds Postgraduate Diploma in Health Systems Management and Master of Science in Public Health (Health Services Management stream) degrees from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine.
