- The enforcement of the articles of association and the regulations and the execution of the resolutions of the association,
- Attending the Executive Board meetings,
- Representing the Forum,
- Encourage organisations and persons to become participants in the Forum,
- Contribute to developing activities of the Forum (agenda setting),
- Contribute to acquiring resources for the Forum (fundraising),
- Write or assess papers and make presentations to conferences, in agreement with the annual plan and with the secretariat.
- Attending the joint meetings with the Advisory Board,
- Attending the General Assembly (GA) to ensure the alignment with the members of the EFPC and
- Encourage an interprofessional approach.

The competences of the Executive Board member include the following aspects:

- Strategic vision for the association,
- Leadership in Primary Care developments, as well on national and international level,
- Acting based on a Human Rights approach and
- Social Accountable when it comes to the role of Health Care for patients and populations.

And the following conditions are at stake:

- Large network, including links with international institutions and
- Fluent English and one other language.
